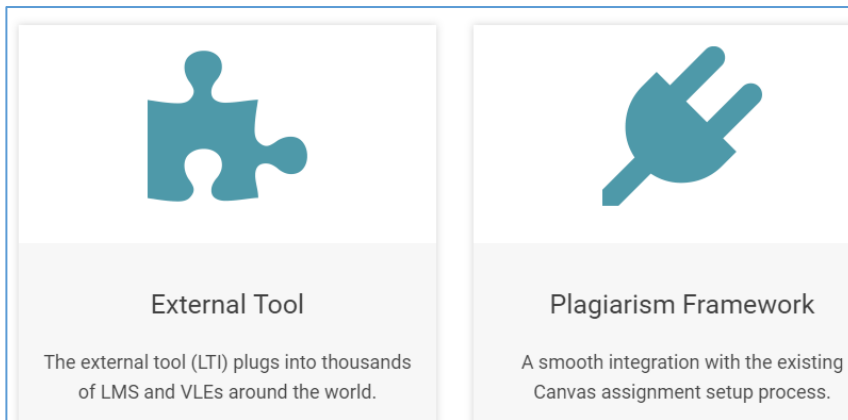


Turnitin for Instructors

That link will open a page asking you to select from these 2 choices:



The **External Tool** will be retired at the end of the summer semester of 2020.

The **Plagiarism Framework** is the newer and simpler way to use Turnitin.

After selecting the correct option, you'll then be asked for your role. Select **Teacher**. You'll find instructions for creating assignments and for accessing and interpreting the similarity report.

You can easily convert assignments using the old External Tool to the new Plagiarism Framework.

- 1) Edit the assignment to change the Submission Type from External Tool to **Online**.
- 2) Select **File Uploads**.
- 3) Select **Turnitin** for the **Plagiarism Review**.
- 4) Customize your Turnitin settings and click **Save**
